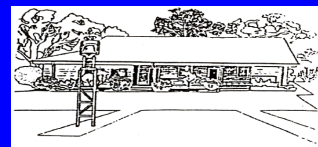

Library Leaves

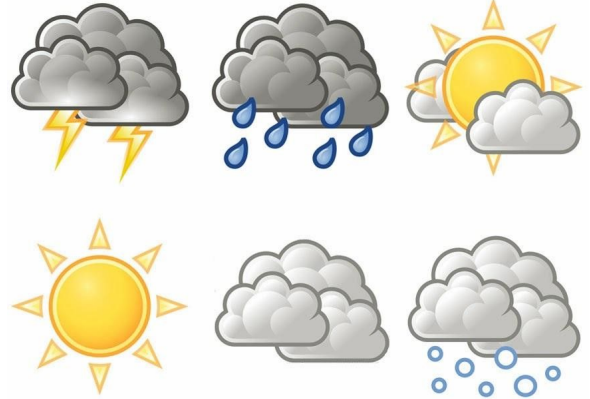

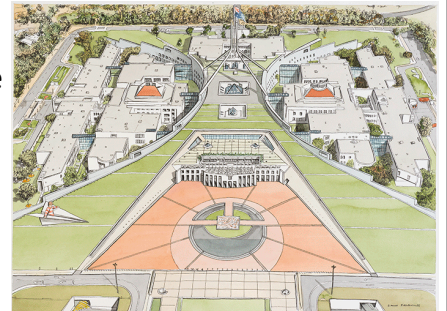
Later we had dinner. It was about a 10 minute walk from our area to the place with food. Dinner was fine. When got back we all had to have showers and get ready for bed.
